Who belongs to the FCFI NZ?

Membership in FCFI NZ is voluntary. It is open to anyone with the desire to be involved and who upholds the beliefs of the Fellowship. The FCFI NZ is based purely on the fact that the Gospel is the Word of God and that as Christians, we are commissioned to serve the Lord. Members are asked to support the FCFI NZ with their prayers and financial gifts to offset administration costs.

We do not exclude anyone who wishes the services of the Fellowship. It is our hope our membership will view the FCFI NZ as a means of serving God in ministry to others. The FCFI NZ is currently made up of about 400 members who actively support the ministry through prayer and financial giving.



Purpose and Objectives

- To promote Christian fellowship within the farming community on local, national and international levels.
- To provide organization for domestic and international missions teams whereby farmers and other interested persons can effectively use their talents and resources for helping meet the needs of the world.
- To present the Gospel message to visitors of various agricultural meetings such as farm and machinery shows and commodity conferences.
- To provide a method of follow-up study for those who accept Jesus Christ as their Saviour and who want guidelines by which they may become better acquainted with God the Father through Bible study.
- To provide a Prayer Ministry backed by hundreds of Christians who have pledged their willingness to lift up the Fellowship and its members in daily prayer. In addition, specific prayer requests received by the Fellowship are forwarded to these individuals for heavenly petitions.
- To publish a newsletter as a communications tool for the news of FCFI NZ activities and articles aimed at encouraging readers to mature in their faith.

What does the FCFI NZ do?

The FCFI NZ serves as an organization structure for domestic and international short-term lay missions trips. Since its inception in 2011 the FCFI NZ desires to utilize farmer talents to support missionaries in the South Pacific. At the same time, new friendships will be cultivated within the mission trip team. These projects involve construction projects on church buildings and chapels, well drilling, installation of irrigation systems and the distribution of seeds and gospel tracts.

The FCFI NZ desires to be involved in "Rapid Action" operations in which farmers have rallied to the needs of their counterparts when drought, hurricanes, snowstorms, tornados and floods have ravaged the countryside.

Over the past five years, FCFI NZ members have presented the Gospel to nearly 10,000 people at National Fielddays, Southern Field Days and South Island Agricultural Field Days through the "Wordless

Walking Stick" ministry. By meeting show-goers with a smile and the ever-popular free yardstick, FCFI NZ has taken God's word to thousands with the simple coloured bead bracelet that denotes the glories of heaven, the sin that prevents us from attaining that glory on our own, the blood of Christ which cleanses us to purity if we accept it, and the everlasting life that comes with that acceptance. The ministry has seen literally thousands of people come to know Jesus Christ as their Saviour.

Through local farmer "bloke sheds", the FCFI NZ has taken the comfort of the Gospel message to agricultural communities, conducting Bible Studies, prayer groups and individual ministry to those hurting from family or financial problems.

FCFI NZ urges its members to be active in their local church congregations and welcomes the opportunity to partner with local churches.
