RAPID RESPONSE DISASTER RELIEF

During the 20th FCF International Conference in Cincinnati, keynote speaker, Tim Haas, National Director of Samaritan's Purse, observed that FCFI could use some additional equipment in its long term recovery in rural America. Tim had arrived in Cincinnati from a Samaritan's Purse first response campaign in New York and New Jersey following Tropical Storm Sandy. Ministry was difficult for Tim and the entire Samaritan's Purse team. Time spent with farmers at the 20th International Conference was an encouragement to Tim and his wife. The Fellowship has worked with Samaritan's Purse in several storms, most recently in Greeley, Colorado following record flooding on the South Platte River. Samaritan's Purse is a tremendous ministry partner.



In March Tom Fitschen and Dave Stutzman from Illinois drove to North Wilkesboro, North Carolina to meet Tim Haas at the Samaritan's Purse headquarters. Samaritan's Purse donated a 40 foot "toy hauler" style trailer that will serve as a command trailer for future FCFI disaster relief campaigns. The trailer features a living quarters in the front and a cargo area in the rear. The rear door drops into a ramp allowing equipment to be driven into the trailer.

The living quarters features a couch, table, kitchen and restroom complete with a toilet and shower. The queen size bed sets up over the fifth wheel hitch. Couples are needed to commit to several weeks of service to help volunteer teams as they arrive to work in a disaster setting. Team leaders with direct the projects, but key leadership is needed to staff the Command Trailer as disasters take place.





Samaritan's Purse built storage shelves and tool cabinets into the cargo area of the new Command Trailer. FCFI needs to assess how this area needs to be set up for tool storage and equipment hauling. The trailer needs a generator. FCFI has riveted the exterior aluminum siding panels that were originally glued together in 2006. One three foot panel was replaced near the side entry door. Lord willing, this "farm shop" area can develop as we face future disasters. The fifth wheel hitch is equipped to receive a 2 5/16th's ball. Whether to use farmer trucks or find a used Ford F-350 flatbed type truck to dedicate to pulling the unit is under consideration. Pray for wisdom in this area.



TORREON, MEXICO

The Fellowship of Christian Farmers, International suspended its Mexico Mission trip schedule after the February 2009 trips to Torreon, Mexico. Local church planting missionaries Rev. Edward Williamson and Pastor Antonio Gomez recommended to the FCFI Board of Directors that it was too dangerous for farmers to travel to Torreon. In July 2014 Joe & Judy Bachman and Rachel Schlagel flew to Torreon at the invitation by Pastor Gomez. Lord willing, small groups of 4-5 farmers will resume Mexico Mission trips in January 2015 to assist our many Mexican pastoral friends and their families. Exact trip dates will be announced as soon as possible.

Pastor Antonio Gomez expressed his desire to have FCFI teams return to Torreon. "The devil has been running through the streets of Torreon long enough. It is time to accommodate the growth of the church during this stressful time in Mexico." Pastor Tony explained. Sixteen church members have been killed in senseless violence in the past two years. The church has grown over 200 people in that same time.

NEW ZEALAND FIELDAYS

New Zealand Christians are celebrating the 200th anniversary of Samuel Marsden's preaching the gospel in the Bay of Islands, Northland in 1814. Marsden was a Prison Chaplain and farmer in New South Wales, Australia. His farming operation included 2900 acres of land and livestock. A nationwide evangelism campaign called, "Jesus-All about Hope" is underway to reach all households in New Zealand with the gospel message. The Fellowship of Christian Farmers, International NZ has been part of this campaign with outreach exhibits at the Southern Field Days in Southland last February and at National Fieldays in June near Hamilton on the North Island. 2470 people heard the gospel in the FCFI NZ tent this year.
