The Fellowship of Christian Farmers, International for the fourth spring in a row finds itself involved in helping families cope with natural disasters that have destroyed homes, barns, fences, and left fields covered with trash that has to be removed before planting. As an organization it is difficult to respond to all disasters during spring planting time, but we are committed to being active in coordinating relief efforts where we can.

The Fellowship has resumed repairing fences on the South Platte River in Northeast Colorado. Most recently a tractor that was in the flood waters was repaired and is running. Many more farms along the 150 miles of the South Platte River from Greeley to Nebraska will need help replacing fences this summer and fall. Hope you can join us. The Washington, Illinois November 17th tornado still has a few farmers in the Minonk, Illinois area picking up trash in fields thanks to FFA chapters and individual volunteers this past weekend. FCFI may be involved excavating some basements and framing up a one story ranch home.

The Lord has opened the door to participate in farm shows in New Zealand. In February, New Zealand farmers set up an outdoor tent display at the Southern Field Days in Waimumu, Southland. This group was then invited to participate at a farm exposition called South Island Agricultural Field Days, in March 2015. Lord willing New Zealand farmers will organize an outreach event at this show that is located near Christchurch, New Zealand's 2nd largest city. June 11-14th my wife, Janet and I will fly to New Zealand to participate in New Zealand's largest farm show called Fieldays. Pray for the application local farmers are drafting to become a "Charitable Trust" in the country---much like being a 501 (3) (C) in the USA. Lord willing we will have New Zealand farmers visit North American farms soon. Pray about attending a farm show in New Zealand in 2015!

This is a very important time in our nation's history for the ministry to continue sharing the gospel message with people at farm shows. Your prayer and financial support keeps the Fellowship of Christian Farmers, International well- funded to continue being a witness unto the Lord Jesus Christ this year.

The Fellowship's shower trailer was set up one year ago in Moore, Oklahoma in a similar Samaritan's Purse command center following an EF-5 tornado. FCFI leader and farmer, Tony DeGiusti sent the FCFI Home Office photographs of the tornado going over his farm place west of Moore, Oklahoma. Tony drove to Rolla, Missouri to meet Melvin Bell halfway to pony express the FCFI shower trailer to Moore, Oklahama. The unit was used by volunteer workers and people in the community that needed to get cleaned up after a long day of working. A proposal to build a second shower trailer for use in disaster work in the High Plains was presented to Co Bank in Denver by De Giusti and the Bank approved the project. The new trailer will have six shower stalls and a full size washer/ dryer laundry area. Praise the Lord for this second shower trailer.
