- 05 June is the traditional month when people marry. I've often wondered whether Adam and Eve were "married" in June. The Bible tells us that ... "for Adam no suitable helper was found", Genesis 2:20. May we not be lax in our opportunity to be productive. Open doors for us to be productive both physically and spiritually as well. And we thank you for the many opportunities that come our way!
