- 01 Happy New Year! I think it is appropriate to take time to thank our Lord for the guidance and provision throughout 2014 and also to seek His wisdom for 2015. Psalm 127:1 says, "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain" which holds true today as always. Also, a Rick Warren quote, "Pray before you pay." Hold us to those words, Precious Lord.
- 02 Here are our recent prayer requests but, first let us thank our Lord for many answered prayers and for His guidance and provision. Let us pray for Craig's granddaughter who has Lyme disease and for our pastors and other church leaders that the extra burden of the holiday season doesn't dampen their Christmas joy or that of their families. Others needing prayer are Laura who remains in the hospital, Lou Ann who has neuromuscular disease and a brain aneurism, Dolly

who has just a few days to live, Ann with cancer, and Linda who just had two strokes. Precious Lord, hear our prayers for each one of these situations.

- 03 "There is none upon earth that I desire besides you," Psalm 73:25. The Bible often uses the metaphor of spiritual thirst as in Psalm 42:2, "My soul thirsts for God, for the Living God." John 4:14 tells us ... the water I (Jesus) give them will become in them a 'spring of water welling up to eternal life." Living Water, we desire your water that quenches our spiritual thirst and leads to eternal life.
- 04 I suspect that we all have "blind spots" in our lives where we fail to see potential problems lurking in our surroundings. The one way to avoid those "blind spots" is to follow Moses' admonition in Deuteronomy 6:6 where he says, "These words (ten commandments) which I command you today shall be in your heart." It is even hard to tell the deceived from the deceiving, But Counselor, help us to avoid the deception that is happening around us and let us be a light in this dark world living lives that are faithful and true to you.

It says all things work together for good. Many of us can look back at 'catastrophes' that made us better people or enhanced our business or gave us wisdom to face other trials. King of Kings, we tend to look on the bad side of things. With your help we can change our perspective and see you working to make us grow in our faith.

- 08 "To him who is afflicted, kindness should be shown by his friend," Job 6:14. When our barn roof collapsed under the heavy snow load, friends we didn't know responded to the need. What an expression of Christian love that was and that is an example of how we should be at all times. Emmanuel, there are those around us who are "afflicted" that we don't see. Open our eyes to those needs so that we can be the friend that they need.
- 09 "It is appointed for men to die once, but after this judgment ..." Hebrews 9:27. Some wise person once stated that "no one gets out of here alive," but they forgot to add, "no one avoids judgment." However, we who are Christians can confidently say Christ is our judgment and He has paid the price for our sins. Hallelujah! Jesus, thank you!
- 10 "Shepherd the flock of God ... by being an example to the flock," 1 Peter 5:2, 3. When Peter wrote this he wasn't just talking to the Church leadership, he was talking to all of us. Someone said, "A picture is worth a thousand words" but so much more is a life well-lived. Rabbi, every one of us has an "audience." May they see you in all that we do.

- 12 "Without delay, He (Jesus) called them (James and John) and they left their father ... and followed Him," Mark 1:20. They did this so that they could be like Him. We are called to follow Him also so we, too, can be like Him. Messiah, you are the model that we wish to emulate. "Hold our feet to the fire" not just today or this week but every day and every

week. We are in this "for the long haul."

- 13 "Then God saw their works, that they turned from their wicked ways and God relented," Jonah 3:10. This is what God did after Jonah preached to the City of Nineveh, a haven of followers and idol worship, and they repented of their sins. God, hold open that same door of forgiveness to us today. Creator God, encourage us to repent of our sinful ways and seek your amazing grace and forgiveness.
- 14 "Fight the good fight of faith,..." 1 Timothy 6:12. Accepting Jesus Christ as Savior is the easy part. Allowing Him to be Lord of our lives is hard. Precious Lord, help us to share and bear the pain with those around us who need our support and encouragement.
- 16 "You did not choose me, but I chose you..." John 15:16. Have you ever wondered why God chose you? I certainly have and I am sure that there are lots of others who would and could be better servants, better workers, and better worshipers. Jesus, thank you for choosing me. With your help I will try to "bear fruit that none will be lost."
- 17 "You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly," Hebrews 12:22. When we pray, whether it be alone or with many, we need to remember that we are joined by many angels. It reminds me of Matthew 18:20, "For where one or two come together in my name, there am I also." Savior, it is comforting to know that we are never alone, that you and the Heavenly Host are "at the ready when and wherever we might be.

- Leviticus 10:10. How do we distinguish between holy and unholy, between clean and unclean? The best place to start is our Bible. It not only tells us about God, it tells us about how God wants us to live. Master, thank you for your message to us, our Holy Bible, and thank you for all the people who lived it, wrote it, preserved it, translated it, and tried to live by it.
- 19 Today is Martin Luther King Day, an official U.S. holiday honoring Dr. King. He was shot and killed while seeking equal rights for all people. Dr. King emphasized serving one another, a theme the Bible also emphasizes. "And He sat down and called the twelve and He (Jesus) said to them, 'If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all." Jesus lead me to a life of service.
- 20 "Both He who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are all of one, for which reason he is not ashamed to call them brethren," Hebrews 2:11. That sentence is a difficult one to assimilate. Let us just say saved and savior are one so we can all be called brothers and sisters. Savior, I had not thought of you as a "brother" before but because of your sacrifice, we are fully adopted into God the Father's family. So, thank you, Brother, for your powerful redeeming work on our behalf.
- 21 "Whatever a man sows, that he will also reap," Galatians 6:7. It only makes sense that a corn seed results in corn and an acorn brings forth an oak tree. But, by God's design, sowing physical and spiritual things results in reaping what we sow as well. Creator God, you created a unique universe where like begets like. May we join you in sowing love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control, Galatians 5:22,23.
- 22 "Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean, wash me and I shall be whiter than snow," Psalm 51:7. King David had sunk to the depths of sin; seduction, adultery, lying, and murder. But, when confronted, he confessed his sin, and was renewed (Psalm 57). We, too, have the same option. Jesus, I have sinned and seek your forgiveness. Cleanse me and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 23 "A Bishop must be blameless, as a steward of God," Titus 1:7. Leadership
