PRAYER GUIDE - November 2014

- 01 Ebola! It is in the news constantly. New cases seem to appear every day. Master, we pray for a solution to this terrible virus. We pray for those who have contracted the disease that they will survive it. We pray for those whose families and lives have been devastated by it and we claim the following verses from your Holy Word, Psalm 122:7,8. "The Lord will keep you from all harm; He will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore". Nahum 1:7, "The Lord is good; a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in Him.
- 02 Today Daylight Saving ends. Don't for get to turn your clocks back one hour. "I (Jesus) am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in the darkness but will have the light of life", John 8:12. Thank you, Lord, for this promise.
- 03 Tomorrow is Election Day. It could be a most pivotal election. I believe that we should vote for righteousness, for sanctity of life, for fiscal and personal responsibility, for the Biblical definition of marriage, and for freedom of religion, speech, press, ownership of property, and assembly (the first amendment to our constitution). "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well", Matthew 6:33. Thank you, Jesus.

By the time you read these requests, they might be considered "old". But, our God is not limited by time. Father, hear our prayers for these and for other needs that have been expressed. Healing, comfort, peace, faith, and provision are our prayer today. Trust in the Lord forever for He is the Rock eternal.
- 05 The weatherman today (10/19) predicts that wet weather may interfere and delay harvest throughout much of "corn and bean" country. This not only increases cost but will result in more harvesting losses and may cause anger and resentment. Creator God, give our harvesters the patience and confidence they need to get the job done safely and adequately and assure them that "in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose", Romans 8:28. "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under heaven", Ecclesiastes 3:1.
- 06 In a recent letter send to "The Levitt Letter", a publication of Zola Levitt Ministries, a person writes, "True Muslims (the Sunni) are loving, peaceful people who consider any type of lying a grievous sin. However, Shiite Muslims believe in terrorism and deceiving to advance Islam ...". The response that (lying) doesn't square ... with the Koran ... which allows (direct lying) and (lying by omission) in the service of Allah. Teacher, we need to stand by and on your Word and not follow false writings or false teachers. "A false witness will not go unpunished and he who pours out lies will perish", Proverbs 19:9.
- 07 "Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this, to visit orphans and widows in their trouble and keep oneself unspotted from the world", James 1:27. Is James contradicting Jesus who said in John 14:6, "... no one comes to the Father except through me"? Hardly. He is telling us that the desired way to express our faith is to be considerate of others and their need. Messiah, we easily

Father, there are many around us who need you. Use us to be the channel that brings about their connection to you. Here I am. Use me.

- 23 "In as much as you did it to one of these my brothers, you did it to me", Matthew 25:40. Notice that Jesus compliments helping one. - 08 Dear Lord, Please grant me wisdom to know when to speak and when to listen. I want to encourage others and to care for them as you have cared for me. This prayer was taken from Our Daily Bread of 9/10, 11/14.
- 09 "Seek first His Kingdom and His Righteousness and all these things will be added to you", Matthew 6:33. In a current TV ad, when people are asked what kept them awake at night, they responded that they would not have enough money to retire on. God's answer for sleeplessness "Seek first His Kingdom and His Righteousness". Jehovah Jirah, we, your people, are so short sighted. When we seek your Kingdom, not ours, you supply all the "things" we need, Thank you for you glorious promises.
- 10 "A merry heart does good, like a medicine", Proverbs 17:22. Are you sick and tired of being sick and tired? How do we go about being merry? There are many ways to be merry but one suggestion comes from Nehemiah 8:10 which tells us, "The joy of the Lord is our strength". Savior, you love both the merry and the grouchy, but I prefer merry. Teach me to see the good side of circumstances. I prefer to be merry in you.

So does John in Revelations 1:6 where he states we are "kings and priests to His (Christ's) God and Father". - 15 "Forgetting things which are behind ... I press on toward the goal ... for which God has called me", Philippians 3:13,14. I suspect we all have things in our past which we are not proud of. Even St. Paul had a sordid past. But in Micah 7:19 it says, "You (God) ... will hurl all our iniquities into the depths of the seas". Hebrews 10:17 says, "Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more". Thank you, Jesus, for not only forgiving our sins but forgetting them as well. You are an awesome God.
- 16 "You are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son, than an heir of God through Jesus Christ", Galatians 4:7. What an amazing concept; of course, that is why we refer to God as Father and to one another as brother and sister. Jesus, what will you be up to next? I have two brothers and two sisters and they are great people, but they don't compare to you. Thank you for making me an heir to all that our Father has and is.
- 17 "I will offer to you (God) the sacrifice of thanksgiving. When we praise God, answer His call, respond to the needs of others, our

- motivation should be to know God. After all, everything we are and have comes from Him. Alpha and Omega, you designed and created us in your image. Thank you for "sticking with us" despite our failures and short comings. You are an awesome God.
- 18 "Behold, you desire truth in the inward parts", Psalm 51:6. I think the sin that Jesus hates most is hypocrisy. In Matthew 23:23-33 Jesus vents His frustration with "teachers of the law and Pharisees". "Woe to you" He repeats several times because the leaders tried to look holy but were "full of greed and self-indulgence". I seek forgiveness and guidance to avoid those thoughts and actions that make me a hypocrite.
- 19 "Pray without ceasing", 1 Thessalonians 5:17. Does that mean that we should be praying continuously? No, I don't think so. But, we should be thinking about Him for every little (or big) gift or accomplishment and we should seek His guidance for every task. Holy Spirit, you are with us every second. Encourage us to dialogue with God on everything.
- 20 "Your words upheld him who was stumbling ...", Job 4:4. In James chapter 3, James tells us about the power of the tongue. It can tear down or build up. Savior, our tongue is hard to control. Like the verse in Job, let us use the tongue to build up. Help me to use my tongue, to bless, to encourage, to strengthen those around me.
- 21 "Go over this Jordan, you and this entire people to the land that I am giving to them", Joshua 1:2. Joshua's first thought was probably was, "How are we going to get across this raging river?" Then he may have thought, "It would be a lot easier if we could leave behind the lazy, the complainers, the 'Holier than thou'. But, God said all the people. Jesus, you are in the people business. You love all the people. Help us to be like you.
- 22 "The Son of Man has the power on earth to forgiveness". Mark 2:10. Why is "on earth" in that statement? I believe it is in there because we are "on earth" and Jesus can and will forgive our sins here, now, on earth, not sometime later in heaven or "on the way to heaven". Messiah, thank you for forgiving me my sin now.
