- 24 "To him who knows to do good and does not do it. To him it is sin," James 4:17. I suspect we are all guilty. We can all complete the sentence, "I should have ..."! Savior, we have failed. - 15 "He (Mordecai) sent back this answer (to Esther), 'Do not think that because you are in the king's house you alone of all the Jews will escape for if you remain silent at this time ... deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place but ... your father's family will perish and who knows but that you have come to a royal position for such a time as this" Esther 4:13, 14. Master, I believe each of us has or will be placed in a critical situation that requires the testing of our faith. We pray that we recognize the challenges set before us and respond positively for your honor and glory.
- 16 "The peace of God will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus," Philippians 4:7. Do you have a heart or mind that needs guarding? I know mine does at times. Our One Wise God, we humans are pretty good at patting ourselves on the back for one characteristic or another, yet failing to use that gift properly. - 18 *"Whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to me,"* Colossians3:23. Most of us are not pastors, Bible teachers, or Christian entertainers
