PRAYER GUIDE - January 2016

- 01 HAPPY NEW YEAR, everyone!! Could this be the year that Jesus returns? No mortal knows. As we who are older approach the finish line, we tend to think more about our heavenly home. The Bible tells us there will be no more sorrow, suffering or fear (1 Thessalonians 4:17). Those are good things but what about those close to us who don't yet know Jesus? When we get to heaven will we just forget about those we left behind? Just asking! Father, we rest in the fact that you have given us eternal life. For whom and what would you have us do while we still have the time?
- 02 "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord," Psalm 150:6. I am not sure our cows (which have breath) praise God but you and I surely should. Think about this. Every time we breathe in we receive oxygen, a free gift from God, so when we breathe out (that horrible carbon dioxide?) we should praise God if for no other reason than that His free gift sustains us. Creator God, we take so much for granted - the air we breathe, the sun that warms us, the rain that sustains us, and the ground which bears us up. Thank you for your many gifts which we don't even notice.

Father in Heaven, you are the only one who can make resolutions and promises and we praise you for your absolute trustworthiness. You are an awesome God.
- 18 Today is Martin Luther King Jr. Day remembering a man who fought and died for racial equality in the U.S. While racial equality is an important and noble goal, it is too bad that any lack of equality even exists. Head of the Church, you must be disappointed that your people have prejudices. We pray that through your Holy Spirit we can all strive to wipe out all traces of prejudice and injustice.

- 19 "Our Father in Heaven, hallowed be your name," Matthew 6:9. These are the beginning words of Jesus' model prayer for us. This two minute prayer covers all the basics and illustrates that prayer need not be long or detailed. Father God, forgive us our wordy and often worldly prayers. Hear our heart and let's visit.
- 20 "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord," Colossians 3:17. There seems to be a cultural wave that sees college grad-uates with huge debts 'flipping burgers' or even going jobless while jobs like plumbers, electricians, auto mechanics, and brick layers go begging. Teacher, we have our own priorities all mixed up. You challenge us to do "whatever we do in your name." Help us to do just that.
- 21 "I am going to send you what my Father has promised but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high," Luke 24:49. We are much like the disciples as we have a chore and we want to get it done immediately instead of waiting for the Holy Spirit to lead and guide us. Jesus, we are not very effective when we do things on our own. Thank You for you Holy Spirit who empowers and directs us if only we will let Him.
- 22 "Therefore, be patient brethren until the coming of the Lord Jesus," James 5:7. Yeah, 'that's easy for you to say' is a comment many of us would respond. The last of the nine fruits of the spirit (Galatians 5:22) is self-control and I strongly suspect that is because it is the most difficult to achieve. Creator God, you have a plan for each one of us and for all of us. Help us to marvel at and live according to that plan and leave the details up to You.
- 23 "All who believed we together," Acts 2:44. "A cord of three strands is not easily broken," Ecclesiastes 4:12. "Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, there I will be also," Matthew 18:20. I think the Lord is trying to tell us something. We are not 'lone rangers'. Jesus, we need each other and we need You. Thank you for your wonderful promise.
- 24 An unofficial 'holiday' today is Compliment Day, a reminder that we should all complement one another, not just today but every day. And, don't forget our Lord. If anyone deserves a compliment it is Him. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What a team! Thank You for being the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end and everything in between.
