Do you, like me, have trouble with the concept of the Trinity, three in one? This verse helps us understand how Jesus could be fully God yet fully man. - 24- *"I have great sorrow and continuous grief in my heart...,"* Romans 9:2. This is Paul lamenting that many of this countrymen rejected Jesus' offer of forgiveness and I am sure you have the same feeling. Messiah, people precious to us do not acknowledge You as their Savior. It has to hurt you as much or more than it hurts me. Use me, someone else, an angel, a situation to get their attention so they will then yield to your offer of forgiveness.
- 25 "Go wash yourselves seven times in the Jordan and your flesh will be restored and you will be cleansed," 2 Kings 5:10. This is what Elisha told a leprous Naamen to do but the proud man at first refused thinking that such a procedure was beneath him. He finally relented and was cured. Is this a picture of you or me as well, thinking we are better than God's often simple methods? Good Shepherd, we are a proud bunch thinking that we have all the answers. Forgive us our folly and restore us as humble servants doing what you call us to do no matter how menial the task might seem.
- 26 *"The Lord is near to those who have a broken heart,"* Psalm 34:18. I think the Lord is setting an example for us. When someone is going through a tough time, what they often need is for someone to be near, to listen, to lean on, and not give all kinds of instructions. Emmanuel, inspire us to be a friend and not a judge or a 'fixer' when people are burdened.
- 27 "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the Kingdom of God," Luke 18:25. Does this mean that the door to heaven is slammed shut to the rich? I don't think so. In Jesus' parable of the talents (Matthew 25: 14 - 30) the talent was taken from the person who had only one and given to the rich person who already had ten talents. But, riches make it more difficult for a person to enter God's Kingdom because riches tend to make one feel less need for God. King of Kings, our country is among the richest in the history of the world and we seem to be separating ourselves from you because of it. Forgive us our sins and guide us to help others rather than to glorify ourselves.
- 28 "Search me, O God, and see if there is any wicked way in me," Psalm 139:

- 08 *"I know that my Redeemer lives,"* Job 19:25. A redeemer is one who pays a price or penalty for us; he pays our debt so the we can be debt free. That is exactly what Jesus did for us when He went to the cross. Redeemer, thank you for paying the price for our sins so that we can look forward to an eternity with you and encourage us to share that wonderful news with all who cross our path.
- 09 "God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved," John 3:17. "For the Son of Man came to seek and save that which was lost," Luke 19:10. Many people think 'God will get you if you don't ...' but, really, God wants to get you to heaven. - 12 "The words of the reckless pierce like swords, but the tongues of the wise bring healing," Proverbs 12:18. Once a word is uttered, it can't be taken back. The old saying, "Sticks and stones will break my bones but words will never hurt me" is obviously far from the truth but I like the second part of the verse "the tongues of the wise bring healing." Counselor, use my words and my tongue to heal, not injure.
- 13 "The Lord stirred up the spirit of Cyrus, King of Persia," Ezra 1:1. The Jews

were captives of the Persians in Babylon but the Lord "stirred up" the king to release the captives to return to their homeland. I like to use this day to especially honor our heavenly father who provides for our every need and expresses His complete and unending love for us. Thank you, Heavenly Father, for who you are and thank you for earthly fathers who not only provided for us materially as we were growing up but also provided a good example for us of how to live.
- 20 Today is the first day of summer in the northern hemisphere. It is when we have the longest period of sunlight and the shortest period of darkness in the entire year. Of course the opposite holds true for our friends who live on the other side of the earth, the southern hemisphere. Creator God, it is pretty neat how You created the earth with a 23 degree (approximately) tilt so that we have seasons and it is even neater that you provide each one of us with the opportunity to receive eternal life through Jesus Christ as Savior.
- 21 "Ask the Lord of the Harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field," Mathew 9:38. Have you asked the Lord to send out workers? Have you responded to the call like Isaiah who said, "Here I am! Send me," Isaiah 6:8? Prince of Peace, we each have our own sphere of influence.
