appearance but the Lord looks at the heart," 1 Samuel 16:7. We may be able to fool others and we may be able to fool ourselves but we can't fool God. There is an old saying, 'Oh what a web we weave when first we practice to deceive'. Messiah, you see through our sinful deceptions. Forgive us, chastise us if we need it, and restore us to wholeness we pray in Jesus 'name.

- 21 "Do not be afraid of their threats nor be troubled," 1 Peter 3:14. Have you been criticized or marginalized because of your faith? Many have but Peter tells us not to be afraid. I like this little poem from Our Daily Bread:

Because of it, there had never been a school in a remote village called Mundari Burra. Peace has been restored in that new country but please pray with us for continued peace, wisdom, and provision as well as godly teachers and leaders to make this school an enduring reality. Precious Lord, hear our prayers.
- 23 "Let your hand become my help," Psalm 119:173. While cleaning out our manure storage pit, I slipped and sat down with a thud. Fortunately, one of the truck drivers was nearby and he helped me get back on my feet by extending his hand to me. Our Lord has a much stronger hand than any person and He is more than willing to 'lend us a hand' if only we ask. Thank you, Lord for always being available when we slip and fall.
- 24 "He has not dealt with us according to our sins nor punished us according to our iniquities," Psalm 103:10. Praise God! He has forgiven us for our failures (grace) and He has not dealt with us according to our iniquities (mercy). Thank you, Savior, for dropping all charges against us. May we follow your example when dealing with others?
- 25 "Pray for kings and all those who are in authority," 1Timothy 2:2. Ouch! I have trouble praying for those who are in authority and even when I do, I
