PRAYER GUIDE - February 2017

- 01 Doyle N. and Tim C. have both been diagnosed with an aggressive cancer. Please pray for their rapid and complete recovery. Bill Brown, FCFI area leader, has a blood clot in his leg. Pray that the clot will dissolve and that no further treatments are necessary. Please continue to pray as well for those close to you who are struggling with health or other potentially debilitating issues, for good health, both physical and spiritual, and for your pastor and other spiritual leaders.
- 02 Today is Ground Hog Day. I don't understand why this day has become such a wildly acknowledged special day and why Punxsutawney Phil has become such a celebrity. We'll have six or more weeks of winterlike weather regardless of what our fury friend does so let's make this a day of extra praise to the Creator of the Universe. It was His idea to create the seasons. Praise His Holy Name!
- 03 As I write this our United States has just installed a new president. What a huge load he has put on this shoulders. He needs our prayer. Like you and me, he's a fallible person and he'll make many mistakes. Let's not write him off as unworthy to take the job or place him on a pedestal

expecting him to cure all our nations ills. Master, pour out your Spirit on Mr. Trump and his many advisors as they guide our country over the next four years.

- 04 "He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world," 1 John 4:4. If you are like me, you sometimes forget that we are a temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19) and we are not alone in fighting our battles and resisting temptation. Holy Spirit, when I forget that you are here with me, be more aggressive, open my eyes and open my mind to receive all that you have for me.

- is "Jesus." Thank you, Jesus, for preparing a place for me and paying the price of admission beforehand.
- 22 "I suffer trouble ... even to the point of chains but the Word of God is not changed," 2 Timothy 2:9. You and I might be limited by time, frailty, or location but the Word of God knows no such restraints. Author of our Faith, your word knows no bounds. Use our limitations and weaknesses as a testimony to your unlimited all powerful presence to all mankind.
- 23 "If I have not appointed the ordnances of heaven and earth, then I will cast away the descendents of Jacob and David," Jeremiah 33:25,26. Are you prepared to see the return of Halley's Comet on July 28, 2061? Because God carefully and precisely created the Universe, we can predict such things as the return of Halley's Comet. - 13 "Present your bodies as a living sacrifice ... which is your reasonable service," Romans 12:1. Another way to say it is that your reasonable service (serving others in every way possible) is presenting your bodies in a living sacrifice. Who among us couldn't do a better job of serving others? Jesus, I believe that is your challenge for us today. Who can we better serve?
- 14 Today is Valentine's Day. We have two families in our church whose last name is Valentine. I often wonder how they handle Valentine's Day? More importantly, how do you handle this special day? Shouldn't we express our love to others everyday? Lord, we express our love to You. Help us to make that a daily observance as well.
- 15 "We are God's fellow workers ...," 1 Corinthians 3:9. On a test plot last year (2016) a farmer was able to get the unbelievable yield of over 500 bushels (a bushel of corn weighs 56 pounds) to the acre. That is more than double what many very good farmers get from the corn they plant. Obviously that farmer did many things right but without God's input he would have failed miserably. - 16 "Lift up your eyes on high and see who has created these things," Isaiah 40:26. When you look up into the sky on a clear night, you get a tiny glimpse of the vastness of creation. We may not be able to go very far from home but we can help support missionaries who can and we can pray., The Holy Spirit isn't limited by time, distance, or finances. Thank you, Savior, for prompting us to go, whether by body or spirit to reach the least, the last, and the lost.
- 20 Today we celebrate George Washington's birthday and the birthday of every president who came after him. Aren't we fortunate to live in a country where we have some say in who leads us? Thank you, Jesus, for the men who have accepted the responsibility of leading our great country and thank you, Jesus, for accepting the responsibility of freeing us from the penalty of our sins.
- 21 "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body according to what he has done," 2 Corinthians 5:10. I don't know what the SOP (standard operating procedures) are when we arrive at the 'pearly gates' except for one thing. When asked why we qualify for entrance, our only answer
