On the cover of this issue of Profit magazine are four photos of the ministry in action. Top left photo was taken in the Great Plains exhibit at the National Farm Machinery Show in Louisville, Kentucky. The Peterson Farm Brothers helped lead the Thursday morning Devotional Service from 8:00-8:45 in the South Wing Seminar Room. Greg and BrookeAnna sang and shared their testimony during the Devotion program. This young couple were married one month after the Louisville Farm Show and travelled to New Zealand for their honeymoon, and while there spoke to four NZ Farm Organizations.

The top right and bottom right photo show the Fellowship's response to learning of drought conditions in south central Missouri in the Mountain Grove area. Truckloads of quality hay came from Tuttle, Oklahoma and Danvers, Illinois. Disaster Relief Coordinator, Tony DeGiusti's truckload arrived first, as evidenced by the dairy cows lining up for a good meal. The truck being loaded was at the Bob Yoder farm north of Danvers, Illinois. Joe Bachman, from Roanoke, Illinois, and Tom Fitschen, Washburn, Illinois used a trailer provided by Bob Parsons to deliver the hay that same day to Mountain Grove, Missouri. All of these men have firsthand experience with going through tornado damage and were willing to donate their time to deliver relief to dairy families going through the drought.

At this writing the Fellowship is setting up a base camp in Woodward, Oklahoma where over 300,000 acres have been destroyed by wild fires. Your help is needed to build perimeter fences and temporary fences to keep cattle out of winter wheat fields. New FCFI board president Dave Carter has led several mission trips to Mexico in support of Tony Gomez. This year, a new church plant in La Palma will get a new tile floor for the church.

"Four of us flew from Dallas, TX to Torreón, Coahuila, MX on Saturday, February 3, arriving that evening and were taken to the homes in which we stayed for the week. We went to the Sunday morning service at the Gomez Palacio church of Tony Gomez. As Tony was in the U.S. that day, Edgar preached the morning service and Ramon Sosa had the evening service. Both men did well. The church is in good hands while Tony is away."

"We had been told that our work for the week would be laying floor tile in a new church in La Palma that men with the Spanish American Mission built last year.

On Monday morning we went to Tony's residence and finished gates consisting of wood slats on a steel frame. As Mexican lumber is not of the consistent dimensions that we are used to, it took some work to try to make the gates look right. Our work was met with Tony's approval when he returned.

The rest of the week our work consisted of helping skilled Mexican workers in laying the floor tile. We mixed

mortar to lay the tiles, grout for them, carried tile and mortar to the church. There was much time spent on our knees cleaning between the tiles in preparation for the grout. Our group learned a lot about the art of laying tile.

We were blessed to be able to attend the Tuesday evening service at the new church plant in Torreón that is pastored by Ramon Sosa. Also, we went to the Wednesday evening service at the Gomez Palacio church at which Tony preached. We left Saturday morning for home. In all, it was a good week with many opportunities to interact with the people there. It was good to renew friendships and meet new friends.

This year's mission trip to Jamaica was led by FCFI board member CP Foster, and took place between February 17 and February 24, 2018 at Nightingale Grove Baptist Church.

The main focus of the trip was to put a new roof on the section of the parsonage that was leaking. With the help of several men from the community, that task was completed in a couple of days. There was no apparent structural damage, but there was some minor interior damage to the ceiling. The ceiling was replaced in its entirety, and since we had a big mess, we went ahead and painted the walls.

Various painting projects were completed at the church including the new sound booth in the back of the sanctuary.

Several years ago, a water collection system was built, diverting rain water into two 1,000 gallon tanks. There was room for one more, so that was purchased and plumbed into the existing system. There is no well on site, so they are totally depended on the rain runoff.

Emmie spent the first part of the day working with them and the teachers and then finished off the day helping us with our projects. Emmie is a retired school teacher so it was a good fit.

Being a small group had the advantage of some close fellowship with Pastor Brown, Jackie, and all the people who made our stay so rewarding. The ladies provided authentic Jamaican cuisine, complete with banana milkshakes. As they would say in Jamaica, all was irie! (To be at total peace with your current state of being. The way you feel when you have no worries.)

In September, 2017, Puerto Rico took a direct hit from Hurricane Maria, knocking out sewer, water, and power to the whole island, affecting 3.4 million people. Calvary Evangelistic Mission operates the Christian radio station WBMJ AM 1190. FCFI shipped a generator to CEM in 1989 in response to Hurricane Hugo. Hurricane Maria flooded out that generator. FCFI, with God's miraculous help, managed to acquire two 3 phase 50 KVA generators, and has delivered them safely to CEM's radio station.

Mark Freed, FCFI member and central Illinois farmer, operates a 3 phase generator to power his grain bin on his home farm. He contacted his generator service man twenty miles away in LeRoy, Illinois, and learned that he had two 3 phase generators for sale. Mark and Dave Weber, his neighbor, picked up the

generators and immediately drove them to Miami, Florida. FCFI friend Tim Haas, Manager of Disaster Relief for Samaritan's Purse, recommended some shipping companies to move the generators from Miami to San Juan, Puerto Rico. Within minutes, three shipping companies were provided. FCFI member, Dave Stutzman, contacted all three companies and chose a company that uses ships regularly to haul supplies to San Juan.

The generators were successfully shipped to San Juan, and have made it safely to Calvary Evangelistic Missions radio station WBMJ. Praise the Lord that they can now resume Christian radio broadcasting to an island in need.

Six months after Hurricane Maria devastated Puerto Rico, 93,000 are still without power and water. Although that is only 5% of the population, that doesn't make it any easier for those 93,000. This has been one of the most expensive and logistically difficult hurricane recoveries to date. The terrain is very difficult to move equipment. The Army Corp of Engineers has been helping the local power authorities restore power, but, by law, they don't have the authority to upgrade the power system. It would make sense to bury power cables underground, although that would take much longer to implement. Even the 95% that is restored endures some inconsistencies of electric service. So the Fellowship of Christian Farmers, International has again met a need to locate and deliver an additional two generators, paid for by Calvary Evangelical Mission, to power their Christian radio broadcasts.

Local farmers and FCFI members Mark Freed, Dave Stutzman, and Dave Weber once again obtained two 50,000 watt generators locally. Preparation for the trip down to Puerto Rico included removing the diesel fuel tank from the bottom of the larger generator, since they have a suitable tank already, and to make it more cost effective to ship. The fuel from the smaller generator was drained into the larger tank, which was not making the trip. The pallets that supported the generators needed to be repaired and resized in order to reduce the generators' footprints, lowering shipping cost. Thick, heavy ratchet straps secured the generators to a flat trailer. The load was hauled by Tracy Bachman to Miami, Florida, loaded into a cargo container, and shipped to San Juan, Puerto Rico. The generators will be used to power Christian radio broadcasts in the area.
