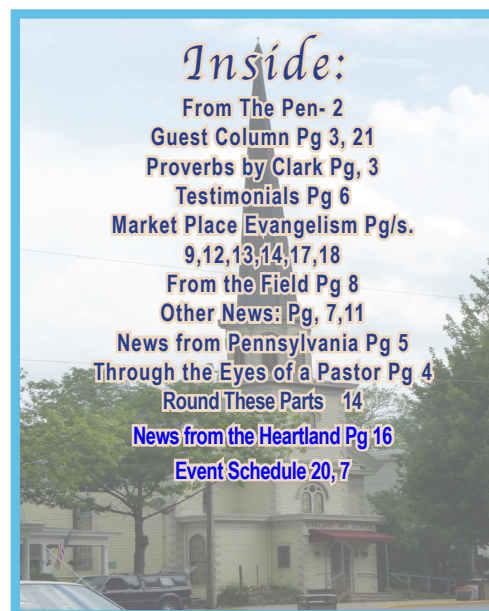

Not Your “Ordinary” Neighbor

I received a call the other day from the funeral home. Our elderly neighbor lady had passed away and the family was requesting me to be the preacher for the funeral. It’s not unusual to get a request like that, but this one was for a very unusual person.

The deceased was a farmer. She had farmed on her own since her husband had passed away 45 years ago. Not only that, but she was a dairy farmer, and she milked her cows until she was 87 years old. She was born in the farmhouse and 93 years later she died in the same house she was born in.

To add to the unusualness of her life, she also worked at a factory in town - second shift. To work the second shift, she had to milk her cows at 1:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. – before and after work. She was not your ordinary neighbor or farmer. In the era of technology taking over everyone’s life, she somehow managed to keep hers simple and old-fashioned. Each one of her cows was her pet, and she named them accordingly. She never had a phone as long as she lived.

I remember a lot of things about this unique neighbor, but the one story I remember the best was one day on a Sunday afternoon, she stopped by our house for a visit. The reason for her visit was that she wanted to know how to find peace with God. She knew I was a pastor and assumed I could help her. She wasn’t wrong. My wife and I talked to her, and we introduced her to the Lord – right there sitting around our kitchen table – We took her into the Scriptures and shared the Good News of the forgiveness of sin and being made complete in Christ. And she eagerly accepted the message and put her faith in Jesus Christ to save her and then she asked if I’d baptize her. So, I did – right there in our kitchen sink.

One of her favorite passages became the **23rd Psalm**. After she passed away her family discovered that she had attached it to the headboard of her bed. And she talked about it often.

She was remarkable and unique, and I look forward to seeing her in Glory Land.

Training for parenting is done so much by example, so I pray that children today will find a mentor and example so that they can become wonderful spouses, parents, and families that our world needs now.

We had a little laugh – that may make the paper – It was what my little sister told her class and teacher when asked, “What does your mother do?” Probably for a Mother’s Day card, the teacher expected shopping, cooking, or cleaning. My sister’s answer was “Mommy sits on Daddy’s lap”. Showing and sharing affection continues to help with their long marriage.

Jesus gave us a new commandment ***“Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.” John 13: 34b-35***

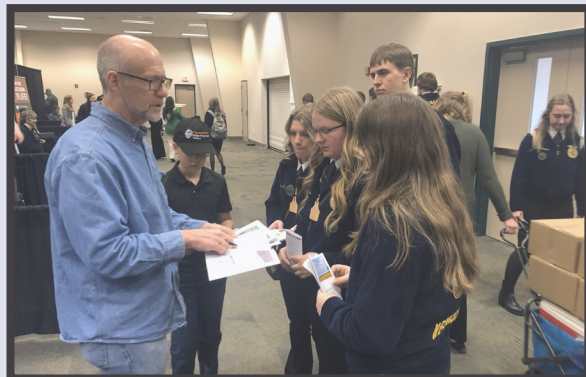
